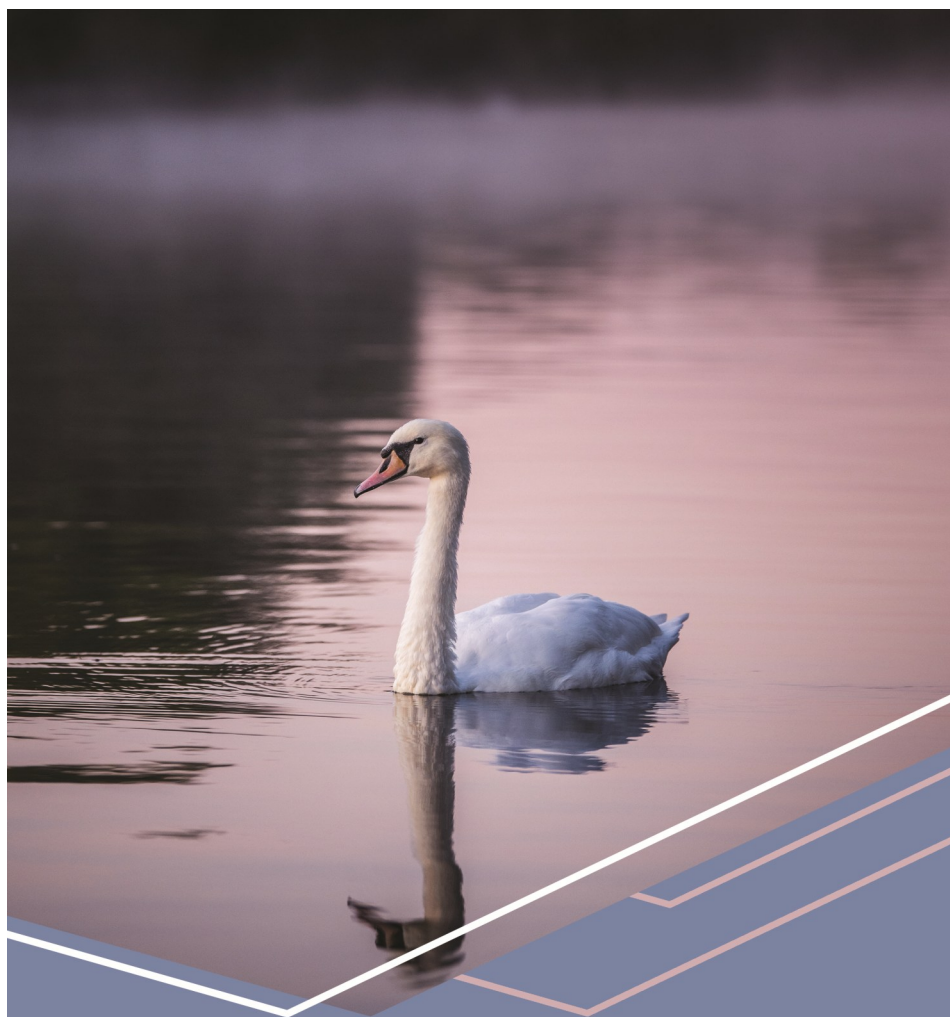

Management According to the Apostles

If you've ever worked in any kind of organization, for-profit or not-for-profit, I'm sure you have attended a conference or two. Whatever our expectations going in, I usually find these conferences expose me to communication and problem-solving styles that are different from my own, nudging me into a little unexpected self-discovery. And it's a great opportunity to meet new people and do something different.

Here's my idea for a leadership conference: The Management Style of the Apostles. Think about it, the only thing the Apostles had more abundantly than holiness was problems. Lots and lots of problems ... most of them of the human resources variety. It's no small feat, starting Christ's Church on earth. I wouldn't want to be project manager of that endeavor.

The Acts of the Apostles is, in some ways, a big book full of problems and ways to solve them. It's a blueprint for tackling interpersonal issues in the manner of a true steward, who encounters every problem starting from the same place: What would my Master want?

It's a question we should be asking ourselves every time we, too, encounter a problem — especially problems relating to other people. What is the truth in this situation, and how would God have me communicate it? How could I handle this in a way that is worthy of the name of my Master?

In Acts, we see a lot of characteristics of everyday stewardship. We see the Apostles mindfully acknowledge the lack of peace that is posed by problems like false teachings, this Gospel's problem du jour. They prayerfully confront the obstacles to salvation posed by these issues. Always, always, always, their main objective is to reveal the will of God, remaining committed to the truth while helping newcomers find avenues to salvation.

Maybe I'm just saying it because it's my idea — but it sounds like a conference we could all use.

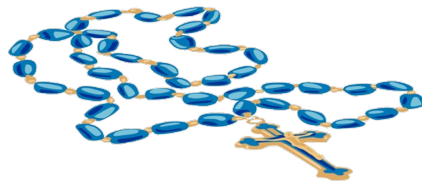

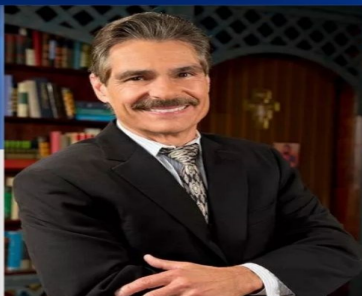

Gospel: John 14:23-29

The Fisherman's Ring

During the Mass of Inauguration on May 18, of Pope Leo XIV, Cardinal Luis Antonio Tagle placed the Fisherman's Ring on Pope Leo's finger. The ring is symbol of the pontiff's authority and reference to Peter, one of Jesus' disciples, regarded as the first pope. It is made of solid gold and engraved with Pope Leo's name and an image of St. Peter, the fisherman apostle, casting a net. Once a seal for documents, it now embodies papal authority and tradition, and is customarily destroyed immediately, to avoid impersonation. Therefore, every ring is unique and personal to each Pope.



The White Pallium

Pope Leo XIV also received the pallium, a white vestment traditional worn by the pope. The pallium is a strip of lambswool which was placed on Pope Leo's shoulders with three pins representing his role as a shepherd and the nails of Christ's crucifixion.

Scripture Lessons:

John 14:23-29, Jesus is always with us

This Gospel reading comes from Jesus' Farewell Speech at the Last Supper. After spending three years together, He had to prepare the close-knit group for His departure. He was going to suffer, die, and rise again. After that night, everything would be different: they would not see Him in the same way again.

Yet, He promised He would not leave them orphans. He would not abandon them. He assured them that He would remain with them if they loved Him and kept His word. Jesus would send the Holy Spirit to guide, comfort, teach, and remind them of all He taught them. Lastly, He promised them — and us — that He would return.

What can a parent do? Remind children that Jesus is still present among us today in the Church. Tell them we meet Him in prayer, encounter Him in the Sacraments, hear Him in the Scriptures, and receive Him in the Eucharist at Mass. Encourage them to pray to Him whenever they want. He loves them always and is never too busy or too far away to help them.

Curriculum Upgrades

- A new phonics curriculum, Ufli, was adopted and instituted in the fall of 2024.
- Utilizing a grant from Panhandle Public Health, a new Social / Emotional Curriculum, Base Education through 7 Mindsets was purchased and implemented at all grade levels.
- Utilizing a grant through ESU 13, St. Agnes created a calm corner where students can take a break to reset and regulate their emotions.
- A new science curriculum, National Geographic, has been adopted and will begin use in fall of 2025.

TRIENNIAL WELLNESS ASSESSMENT RESULTS 2023/24

POLICY COMPLIANCE:

St. Agnes School utilized the WellSat Assessment as a tool to measure the strength and comprehensiveness of our Wellness Policy. This was completed in 2023. St. Agnes School is required to complete this assessment every three years.

The following areas are reviewed:

- 1) Nutrition Education; 2) Standards for USDA Child Nutrition Programs and School Meals; 3) Nutrition Standards for Competitive and Other Foods and Beverages; 4) Physical Education and Physical Activity; 5) Wellness Promotion and Marketing; and 6) Implementation, Evaluation and Communication.

WELLNESS POLICY GOALS FOR 2025/26

- Continue to incorporate Health and Wellness Education into Science Curriculum at all grade levels.
- Utilize community assets such as Panhandle Public Health to provide Professional Development and Wellness Opportunities for St. Agnes Staff annually.
- Continue to expand and integrate Social and Emotional Learning Programs into the St. Agnes curriculum.

KEY ACHIEVEMENTS 2024/25:

- Aligned the local Wellness Policy goals with Federal Requirements.
- Developed and Adapted Snack/Celebration Policy for St. Agnes School to improve overall compliance with Smart Snack Guidelines in the classroom, as well as during school parties.
- Provided Social and Emotional Wellness Activities and Learning Opportunities for all students in all grade levels.
- Three Staff Members were trained in Psychological First Aide at the WNCC Harms Center.
- Safeway Pharmacy held a Flu Shot Clinic at St. Agnes School for staff and school families in the Fall, 2025.
- Members of the Wellness Team worked with the new vendor for our School Lunch Program . Assisted the Vendor with understanding the USDA School Lunch Program requirements and implementation at St. Agnes School.
- Utilizing a grant from Panhandle Public Health, St. Agnes School purchased a Social/Emotional Learning curriculum, Base Education (7 Mindsets) - which provides a lesson-based approach to Social and Emotional Learning.
- Utilizing a grant from the Educational Service Unit, St. Agnes School created a calm corner for students.
- Students participated in many events which incorporated physical activity ~ Track Field Day, Corn Hole Tournament, Kickball Tournament, Singspirations Show Choir, and much more.

What's Happening at St. Agnes School.....

Whole School Projects

- Our yearly penny push raised \$125 and was donated to the Scottsbluff / Gering Soup Kitchen
- Our annual hotdog feed raised \$610 and purchased Christmas gifts for 7 children in conjunction with the Truck of Love.
- Students led weekend Mass (taking responsibility for all ministries) on 4 occasions.
- Cards were created for Nursing Home residents.
- Singspirations performed for multiple community groups.
- 3rd - 5th grade students assisted with the Knights of Columbus Toy Wrapping project.

Student Council Projects

Students in 3rd, 4th and 5th grades have the opportunity to participate in student council where we strive to learn leadership skills and the importance of service to others. A multitude of service projects were completed this year.

- Assisted with the parish/school grounds cleaning and mulching project



Learning & Growing

Our school prides itself on providing fun and educational experiences for all our students. A number of extra activities occur to enhance the learning of our students.

- Special Services (Speech/Special Education) provided by SBPS for qualifying students
- Development of leadership skills using the principles of the Steven Covey program, Leader In Me
- Fieldtrips at all grade levels
- Music opportunities that include: band and orchestra at 5th grade, the playing of instruments in all grades including: basic rhythm instruments (K-2), percussion instruments (3rd) recorders (4th) and ukuleles (5th)
- Singspirations Show Choir—open to any 4th or 5th grade student, 2 all school music programs per year
- Faith Formation includes: Weekly Mass, Discipleship Fridays, formal religion instruction, character building programs (Golden Rule & Virtuous Student)
