



God's Game of Telephone

You've probably played the game of "pass it on" before, maybe years ago on the playground. It's a simple concept: one person whispers something in another person's ear, and it gets repeated person by person throughout the group, until finally the last one to hear the message has to say it out loud. Whatever ends up being said at the end of the game is usually a far cry from the original statement, and everyone has a good laugh.

As individuals, we don't receive news in the same way. Our personalities, our histories, our weaknesses, and our strengths determine how we interact with information we encounter in the world, both good and bad. One person will interpret a compliment positively; someone else will take offense. One person reacts to news of a job promotion with joy, another is disappointed that now they will have less time with their family. The same news can mean completely different things to different people.

But what God gives us is the truth in love, and the truth in love is the same in every place and in every time, for every person of every race. When Christ prayed to the Father that "the love with which you loved me may be in them," he was asking that the magnificent gift that had been imparted to him would also be imparted to us.

Our job is to play a game of pass it on with this gift of love. How do we keep it from becoming warped? Through remaining committed to the word of God, to the sacraments, and to one another.

In this game, we don't change the message. The message changes us. And we have to give it away to keep it.

2025 Nebraska Knights of Columbus Family of the Year Winner

We are honored to be the recipient of the 2025 Nebraska Knights of Columbus Family of the Year Winner – Schiff Family! Knights of Columbus is all about family, and this is the highest award we can ever achieve from the Nebraska Knights of Columbus, and we are proud that they are from our St. Agnes Catholic Church Parish and local Knights of Columbus Scottsbluff 2681 Council.

The Schiff family that has gone above and beyond with their generosity to the St. Agnes Catholic Church, St. Agnes Catholic School, community, and our great state of Nebraska. They have 6 children, ages 13 to 2, and are often found leading the Rosary before Mass. Their children, that are of an eligible age (Reagan and Ruby), also play their part by being Altar Servers.

Finding strength within the community and through the sacrament of marriage is at the heart of what this couple does. This past September they worked to bring 2 professional Catholic marriage counselors from Colorado Springs, donated the speaker fees, and led the Marriage Night for the couples in the St. Agnes Catholic Church. They are also big advocates for the local Catholic School, often donating funds to the annual school "St Agnes Premiere Event", which is the biggest fundraiser for the school. In addition to the support they give the local Catholic School, the Schiff family often gives their time and financial support to the Church and even the Diocese of Grand Island.

Scott serves at Church as an Extraordinary Eucharistic Minister. He also teaches the 7th Grader Religious Education Classes from August 2024 to May 2025. As a member of the Knight of Columbus, he gives his time by helping with several of the local council projects, including the Fish Fry. He also helps with cooking hamburgers and hot dogs for the St Agnes Catholic School open house to welcome students, parents, administration and teachers at the start of the school year. And not only does he do the cooking, but he also donated beef and hot dogs for the event. This Knight can also be found helping with the annual parish picnic where he brings his own trailer grill for cooking.

This Knight's wife Kristin is a Sacristan, Extraordinary Eucharistic Minister and Lector at St. Agnes Catholic Church. Kristin led the Advent Encounter event in December at St Agnes Church with Sister Teresa Harrell to promote Advent. She gives her time by co-leading the Valley Catholic Neighbors in Need (VCNIN), which is a program created to help those in need by providing food during the holidays, coordination with the Knights of Columbus for the Toys for Tots for kids at Christmas and making other resources available to people that need it.

The biggest project the Schiff Family have done extends beyond the Catholic Church and touches the lives of everyone. In June 2024, this family hosted the Cattleman's Ball of Nebraska, which is an annual 2-day event in Mitchell, Nebraska that raises money for cancer research at the Fred and Pamela Buffet Cancer Center in Omaha, Nebraska. Hosting this event requires more than 1,000 volunteer hours, coordination of multiple committees, and over a year of planning. Through their hard work, dedication, and generosity the Schiff family was able to help raise more than \$1.7 million to further the fight against cancer.

Traveling adventures: Invoke St. Christopher, the patron of travelers, who according to legend safely carried the Christ Child across a river. For air-bound journeys, turn to St. Joseph of Cupertino. Celebrated for his humility and piety, he is said to have levitated due to spiritual ecstasy.

Outdoor activities: Immerse yourself in the natural world with St. Francis of Assisi. His love for all creation shines through in his "Canticle of the Sun." Patron of animals, he famously brokered peace between a menacing wolf and a terrified town.

Barbecues and campfires: Celebrate with the spirit of St. Lawrence, a third-century Roman deacon who humorously faced martyrdom. As he was roasted alive, he remarked, "I am well done. Turn me over." His courage and wit make him a fitting patron for grill enthusiasts.

Water fun: When swimming or sailing, remember St. Adjutor of Vernon, the patron saint of swimmers, who swam to freedom to avoid capture. Or, set sail with St. Brendan the Navigator, a fifth-century Irish abbot renowned for his reported journey to the "Promised Land of the Saints" and his safe return.

What to do when "everyone else is doing it"

Your 10-year-old wants to play a T- or M-rated video game because "everyone else has it." Your 8-year-old wants a phone to send emails and messages like "all" her friends. So how do we decide wisely when our children insist that everyone else is doing it?

Start by asking: Is this good for my child's soul? Will it help build the virtues essential to strong character—faith, hope, charity, prudence, justice, fortitude, and temperance? Or could it hinder growth of these critical virtues?



Seek guidance from trustworthy parents, especially those with more experience. Their perspective can help you see more clearly.

Trust your instincts. Just

because something is popular doesn't mean it's good. If something doesn't feel right, it probably isn't. God often speaks to us through that quiet inner sense.

Most importantly, pray. Actively ask God for the grace to lead your children well. He can reach their hearts in ways we can't. A simple prayer — "Jesus, I trust in You"—can lead to the best, most trustworthy guidance.
